The founding idea was to establish an institute where university graduates from many different European countries could study and live together in preparation for careers related to European cooperation and integration.

Our long-lasting objective at the College of Europe in Natolin has always been to prepare our students to think beyond disciplinary boundaries, beyond preconceptions, and to encourage them to build bridges and embrace a wider perspective on Europe and the world.

1948

The Hague Congress:

Salvador de Madariaga, Winston Churchill, Paul Henri Spaak and Alcide de Gasperi, among others, decide to establish the College of Europe.

1949

Establishment of the College of Europe in Bruges, Belgium, offering postgraduate studies and training in European affairs

1992

Establishment of the College of Europe in Natolin (Warsaw), Poland, at the time of the reintegration of the European continent after the end of the Cold War

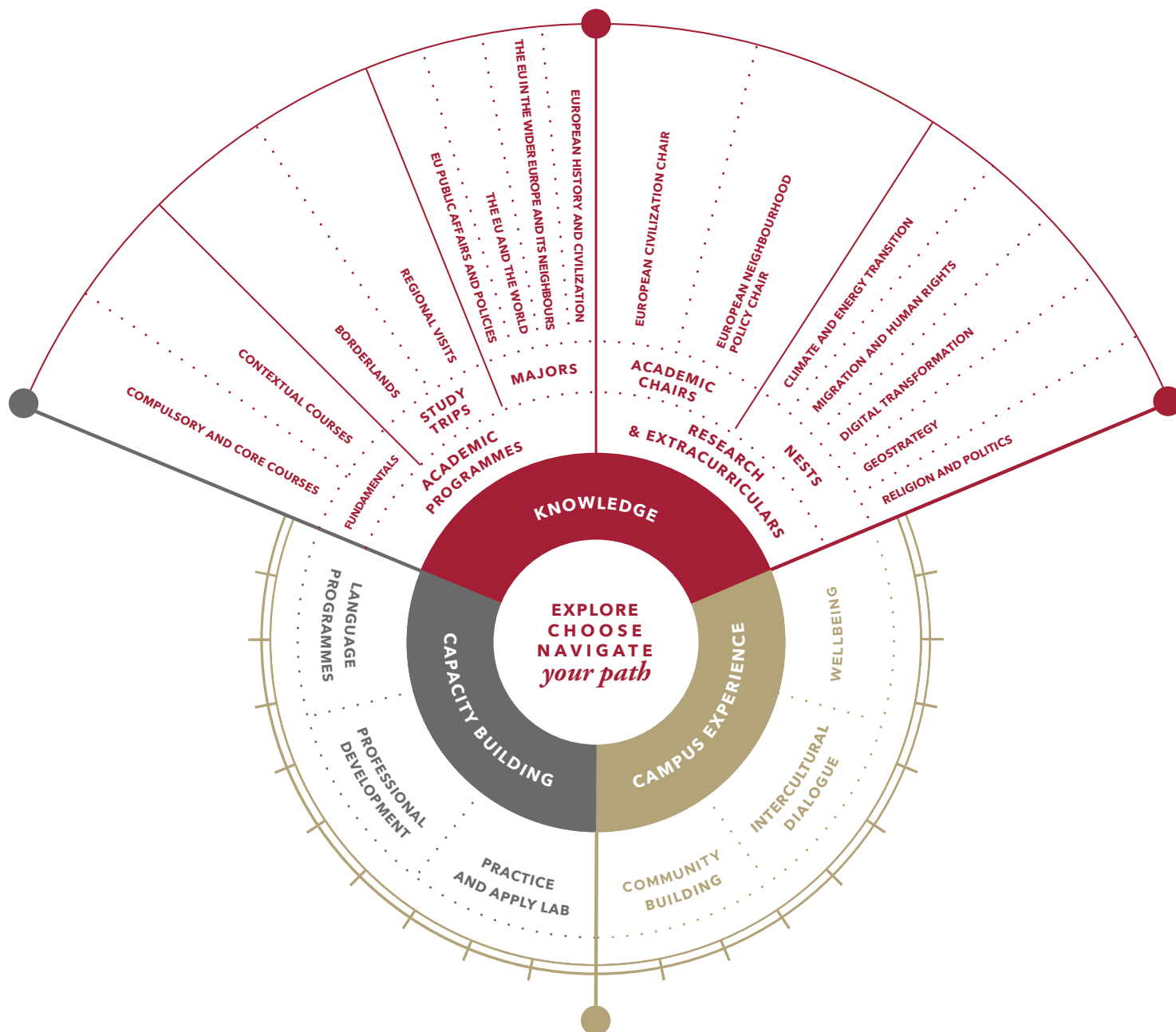
NATOLIN OFFER

Study Trips are a unique element of the academic offer of the College of Europe in Natolin. They provide invaluable field experience of studied themes and acquaint students with the cultural and historical heritage of visited countries, while allowing them also to benefit from encounters with academics and practitioners, journalists, NGO representatives, civil society members and local policymakers directly involved in issues on the ground.

Although the Study Trips are largely academic in character – devoting much of the schedule to lectures, debates, and conferences – they also incorporate cultural exposure and community bonding elements of equal value. Students interact with local communities, visit local landmarks, and experience local customs over the trips – which take place early in the first semester and midway through the second semester of studies.

WARSAW

NATOLIN

The Natolin campus occupies a historic estate and nature reserve of 120 hectares. Once the royal hunting grounds of the Kings of Poland, the campus remains unto this day a quiet island of green within the vibrant Warsaw metropolis.

STUDENT RESIDENCES

The campus in Natolin boasts two residence buildings on-site and additional accommodation located nearby. All residences contain single, fully equipped student rooms, and other features include an exercise zone (with a gym and sauna), spacious study rooms, and common spaces for social and recreational activities.

NATOLIN RESTAURANT

The Natolin Restaurant caters with full board to students for 7 days a week under several diet plan options. Students are also regularly treated to special culinary dishes prepared by the restaurant on feast days, as well as the cuisine of cultures represented on the campus (during the Natolin Cultural Days).

NATOLIN LIBRARY

Natolin also hosts one of the largest European Studies libraries in Central Europe, with extensive printed and electronic collections. The library features over 46,000 titles on-site and access to several platforms with over 600,000 e-books and e-journals.

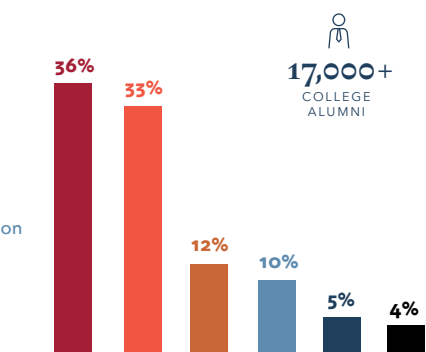

The European Interdisciplinary Studies programme is aimed at university graduates with an academic background in a varied range of disciplines – such as law, economics, political or social sciences, history, philosophy, geography, linguistics, or journalism – and who are interested in approaching the process of European integration from a broad and interdisciplinary perspective.

Graduates with degrees in other disciplines (such as natural sciences, engineering, etc.) who demonstrate a high academic level and a keen interest in European affairs are also encouraged to apply.

MASTER OF ARTS IN TRANSATLANTIC AFFAIRS (MATA)

– a unique joint degree

The 21st century brings with it numerous complex challenges for the United States and the European Union. These challenges must be taken up by a new generation of leaders across public and private sectors. This 2-year joint Master of Arts, in cooperation with The Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts University, prepares graduates for positions in transatlantic leadership.

At the College of Europe in Natolin, the fees of 29,000€ include tuition, registration, examinations, study trips, language courses, full board (7 days/week) and accommodation, as well as on-campus sports facilities.
